<p>Preparation</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Clean ground thoroughly by sweeping prior to painting• Select smooth surface

<p>Timing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• 3 hours required (on a dry day!)	
<p>Choice of Games</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• It is encouraged that children are involved in the selection and location of the various playground games. Please ensure supervision at all times	
<p>Process</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Layout complete stencil set for playground game• <i>For hopscotch please note ‘+’ either side to aid alignment of both sheets</i>• <i>For activity circuit these can be spaced as required</i>• Secure stencils to the ground with masking tape• Ensure stencils are not upside down. Put side with writing face up• Cover sections not being painted with cardboard or newspaper	

- Shake paint can well
- Hold can in a vertical position
- Nozzle of can should be 4-6 inches above ground when applying paint







- Leave for 15mins to dry before removing stencils
- Lift stencils carefully – use two people to avoid smudging



Important

- Health and Safety is a priority at all times
- Cordon off work area during work and for up to one hour after
- Leave excess paint on stencils to dry before replacing them in the black case
- Please insert the stencils carefully in to the black case
